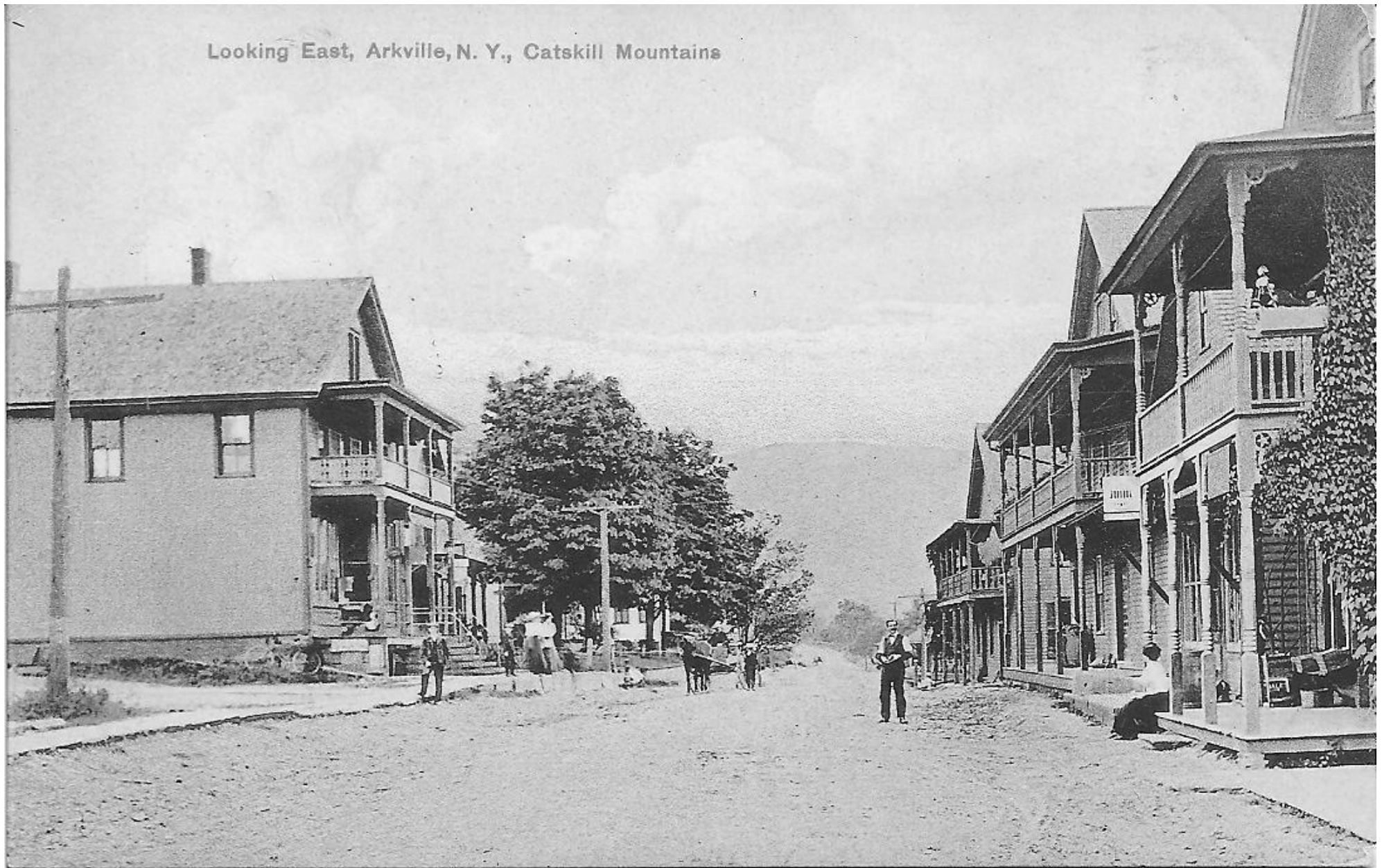

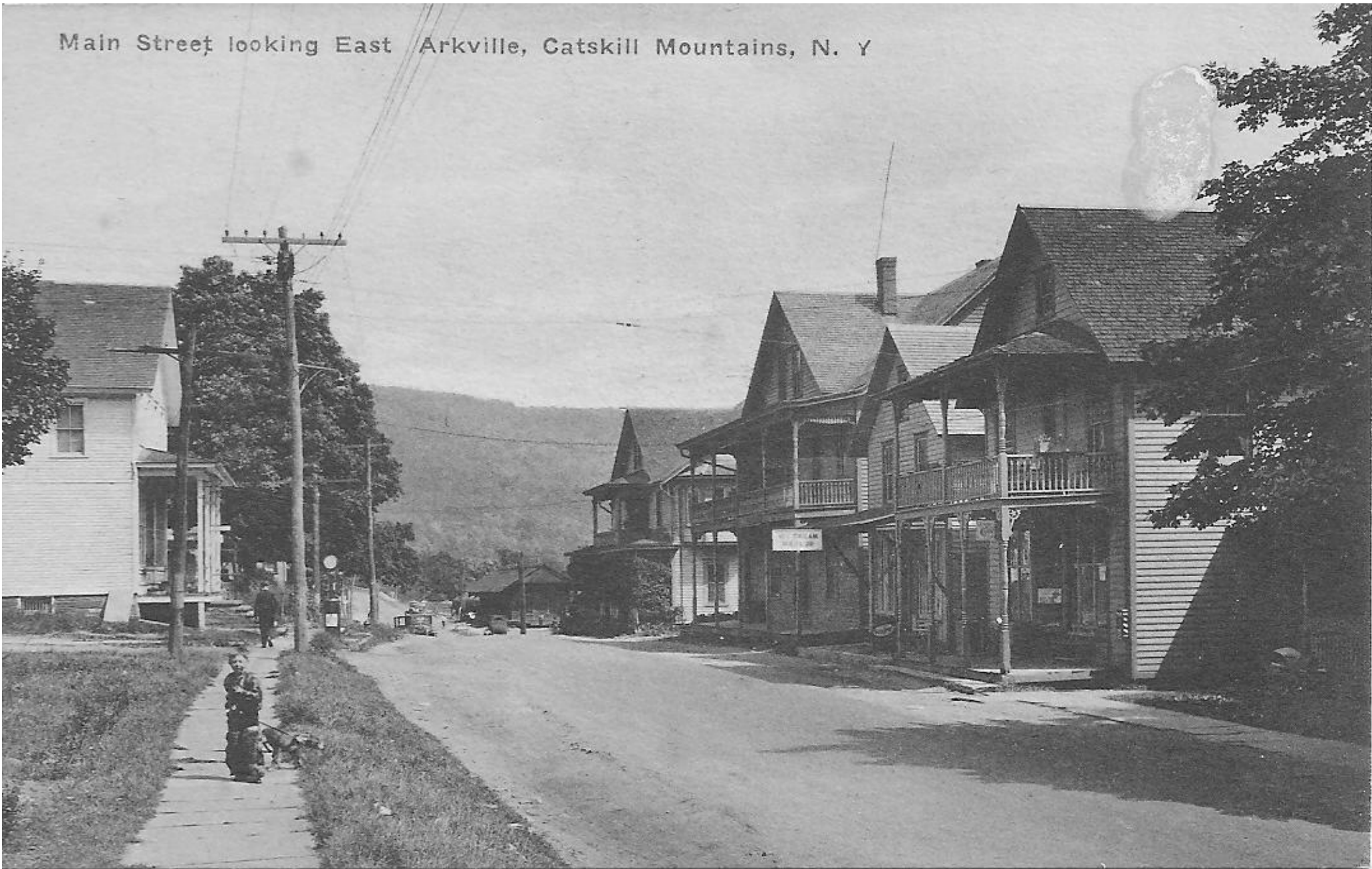

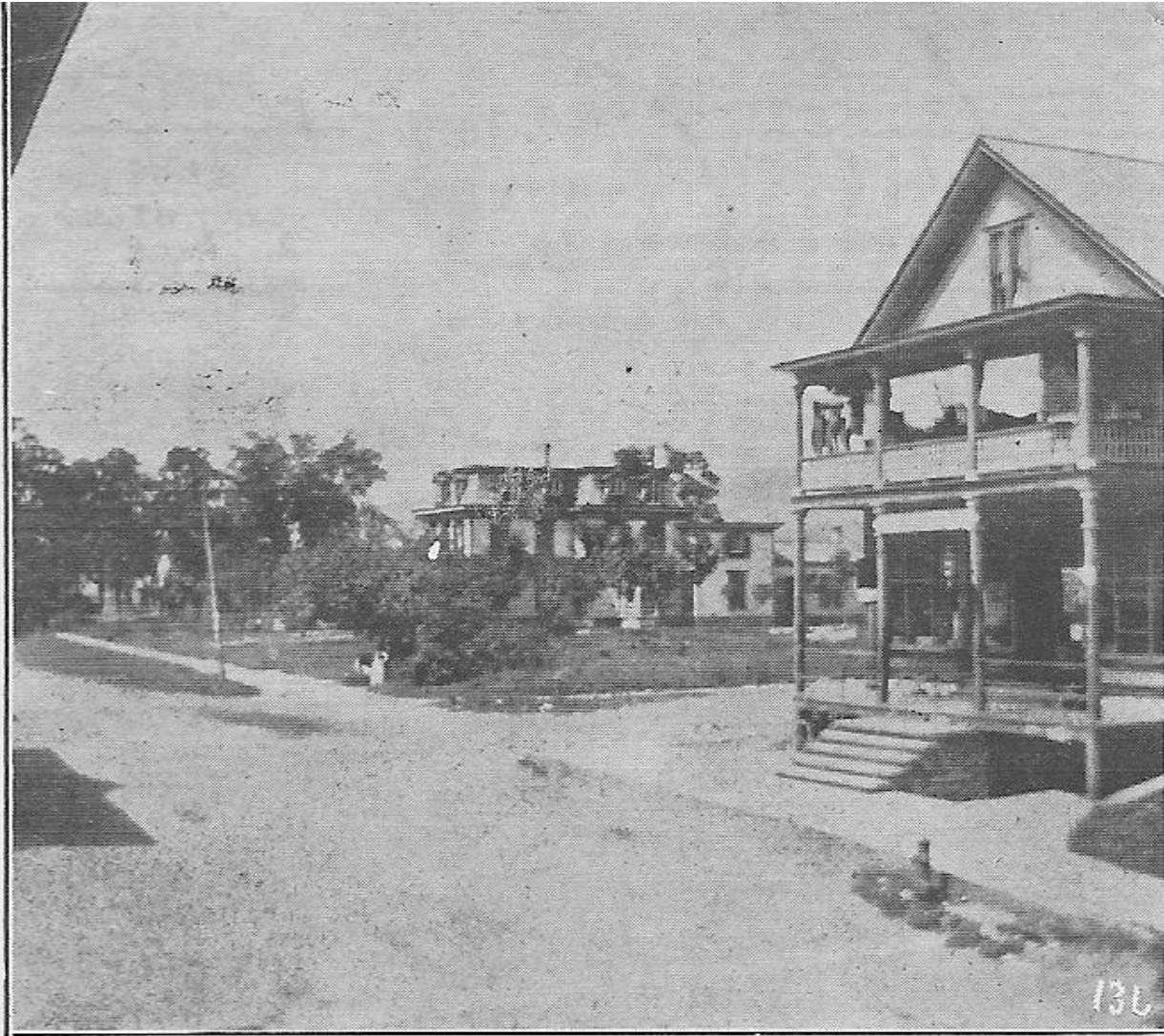

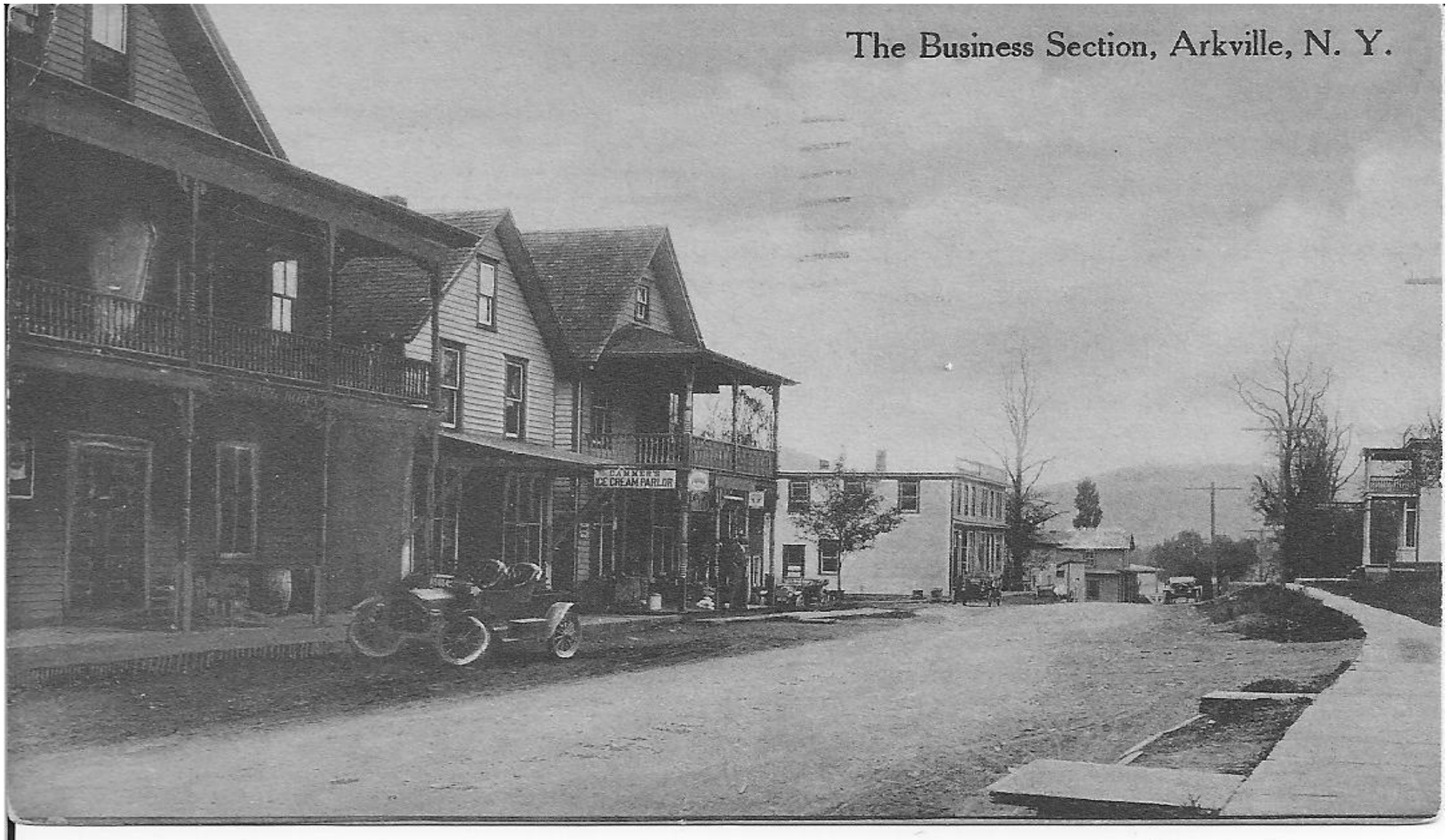




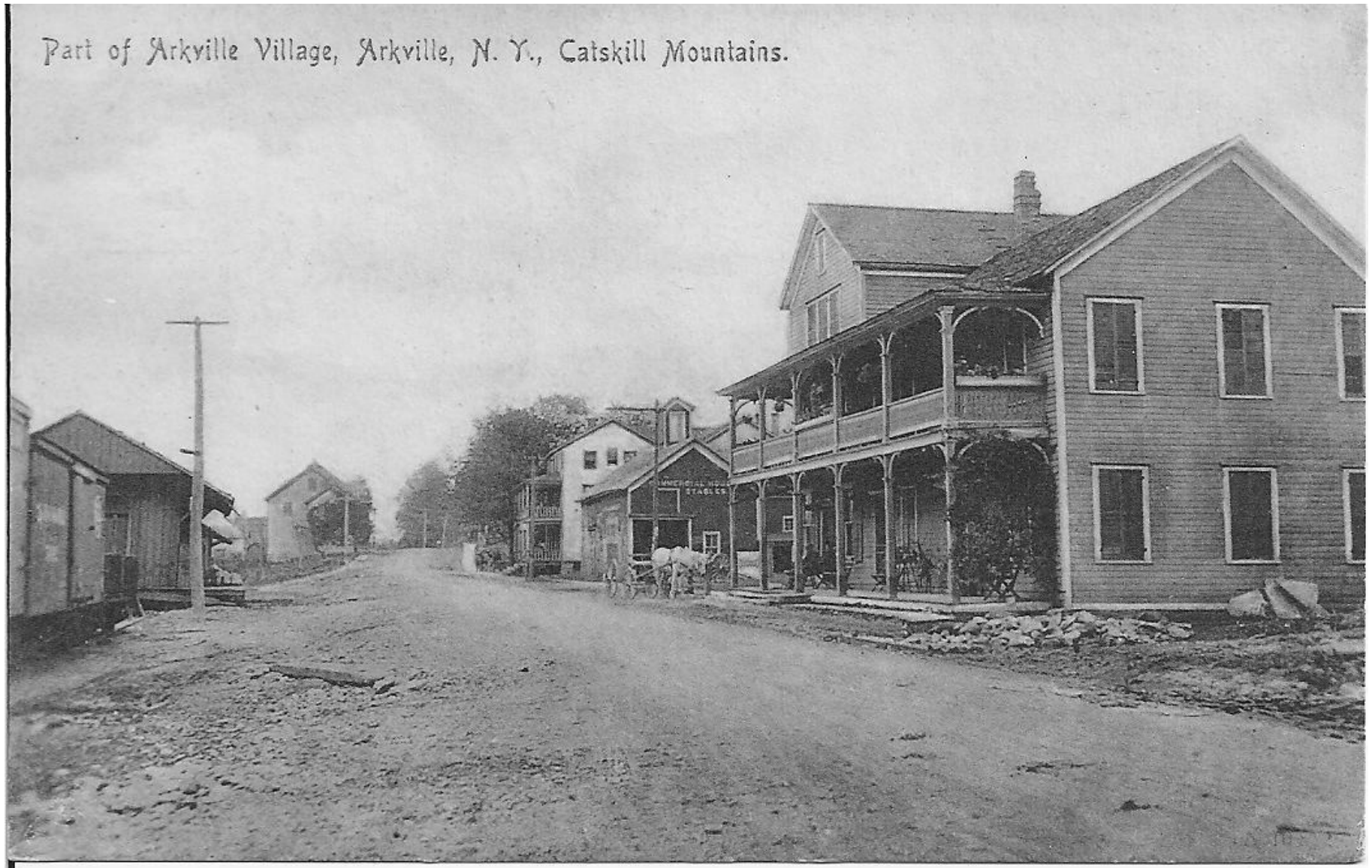

in middle is Sherwood Griffin's Store



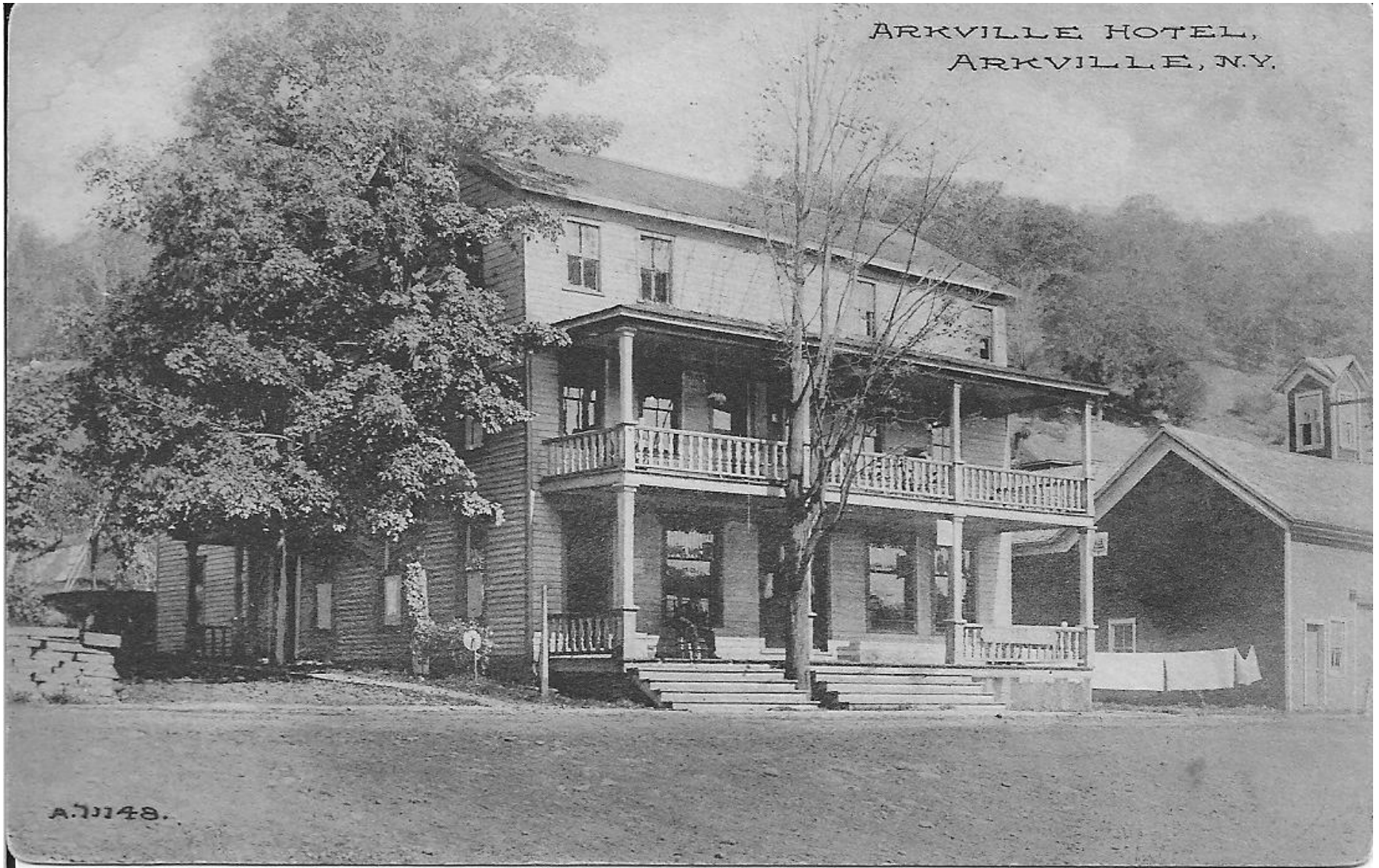
Part of Arkville Village (Route 28, looking west

Later site of Meadow Brook, Track 28, Railz



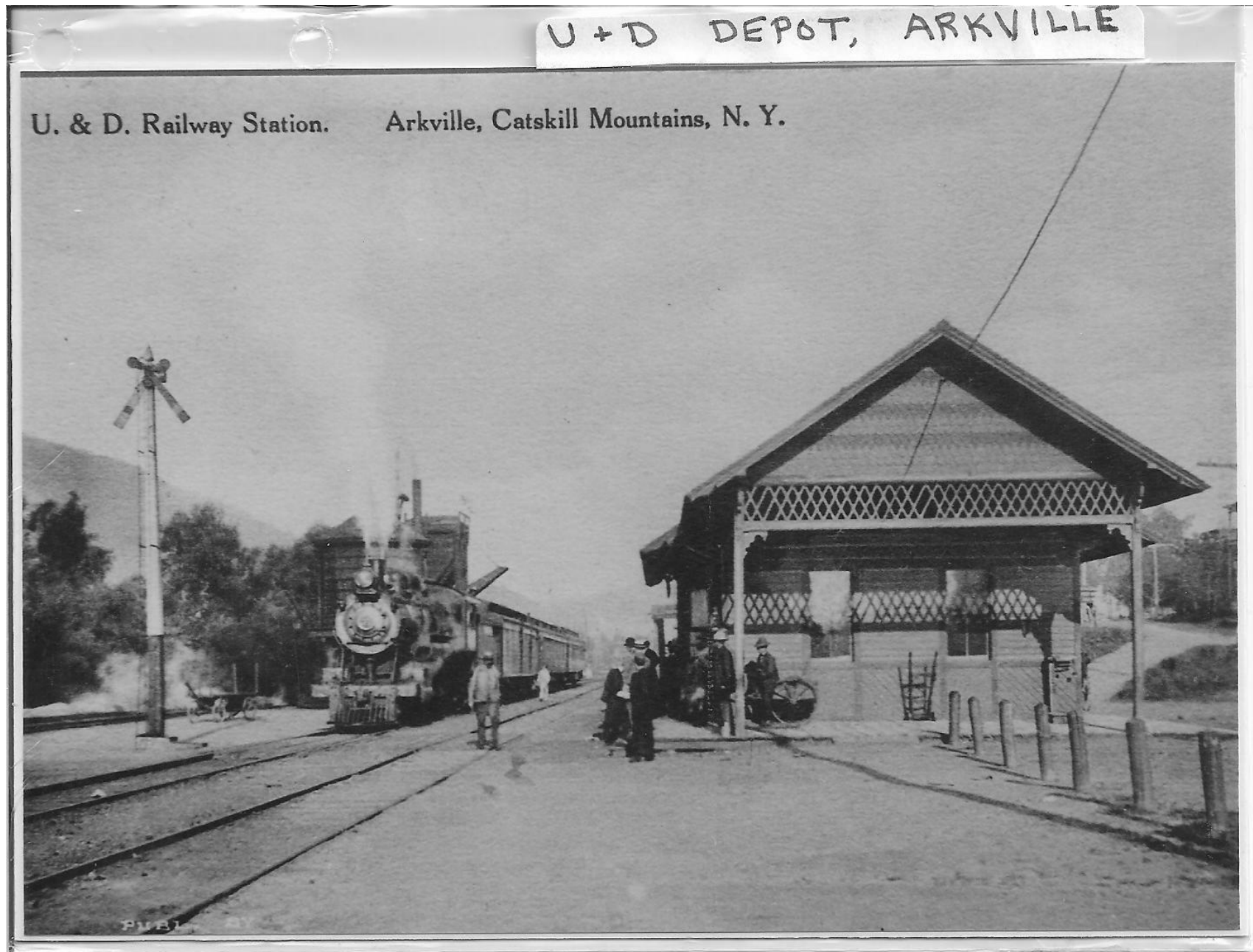

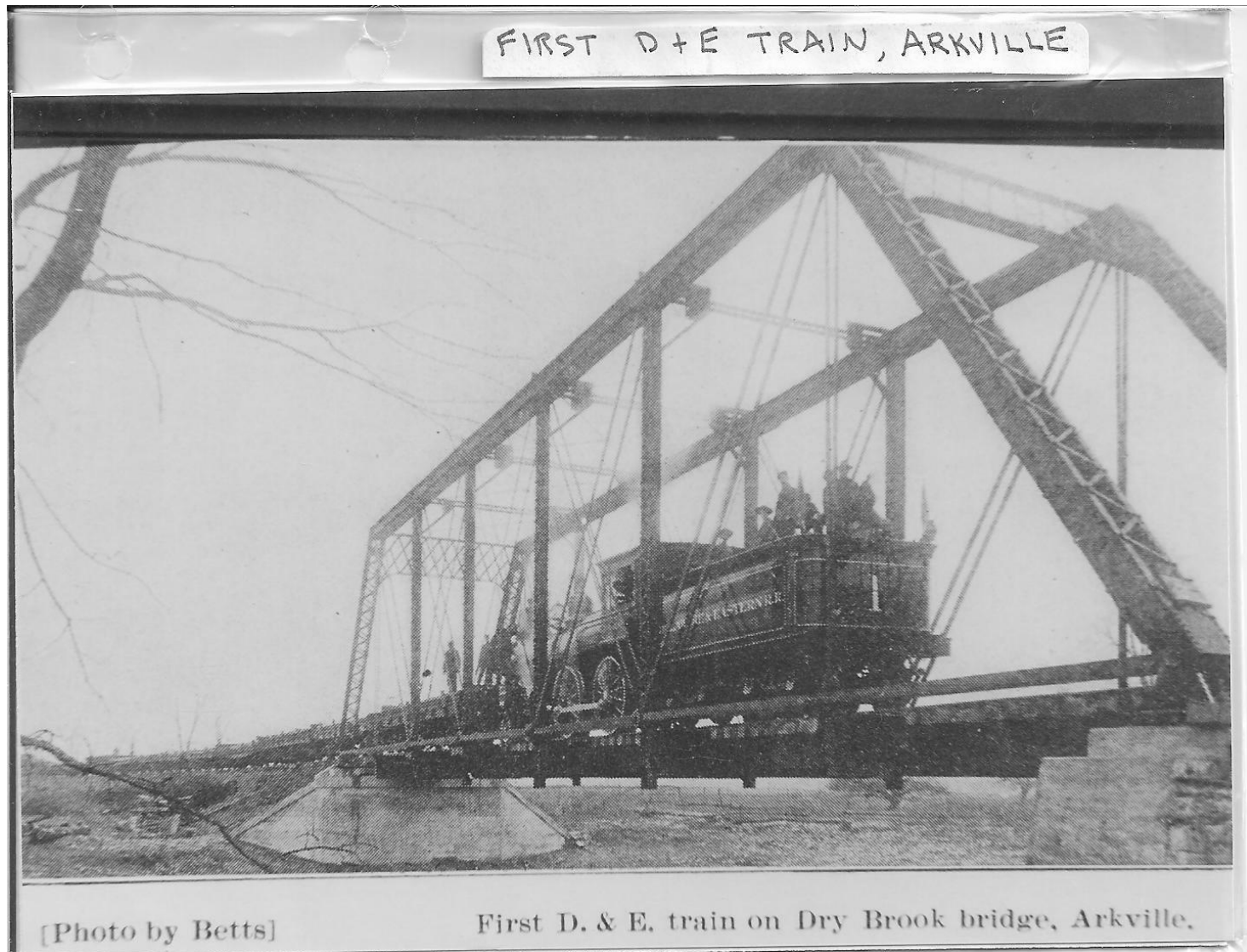

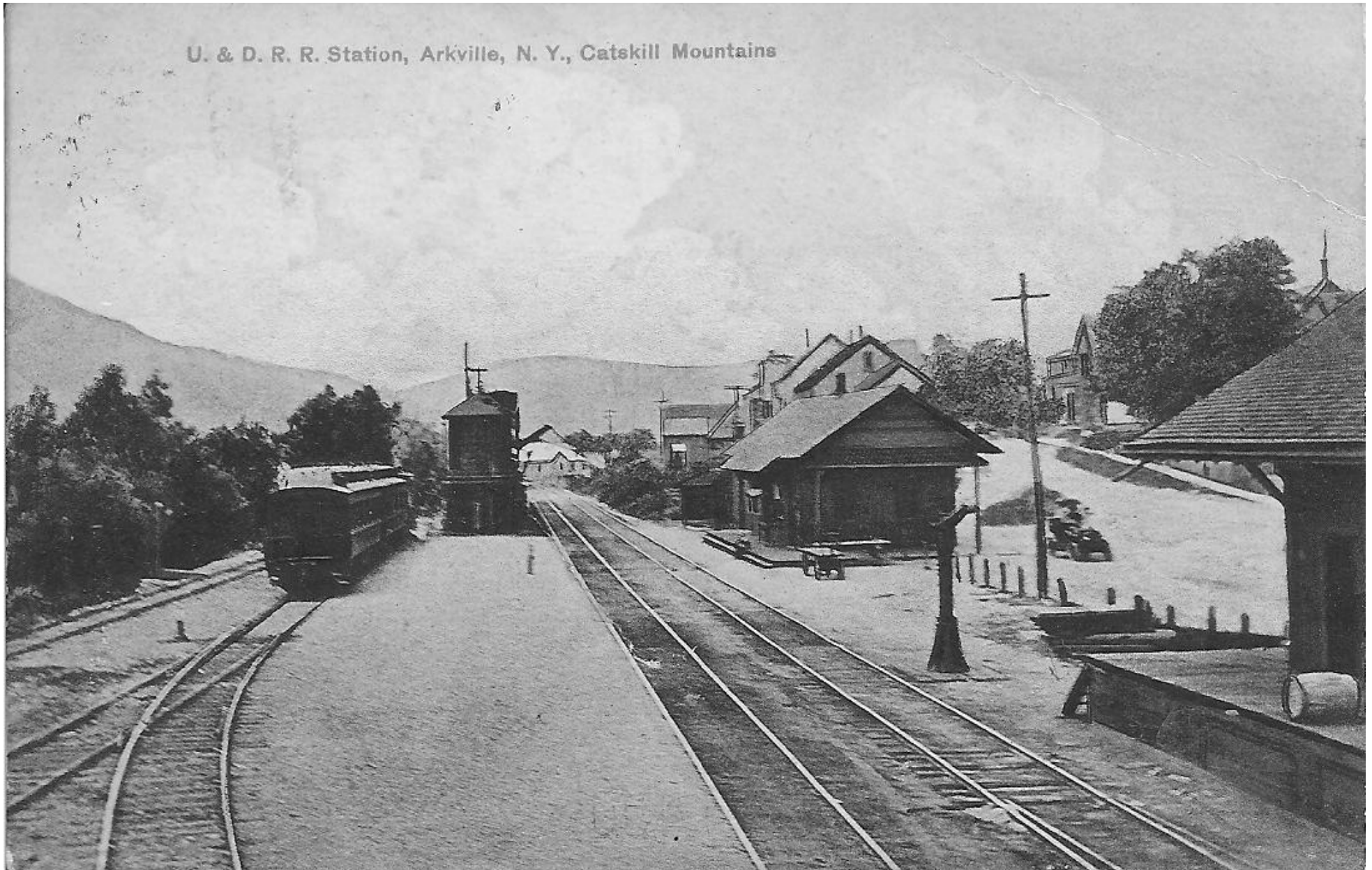




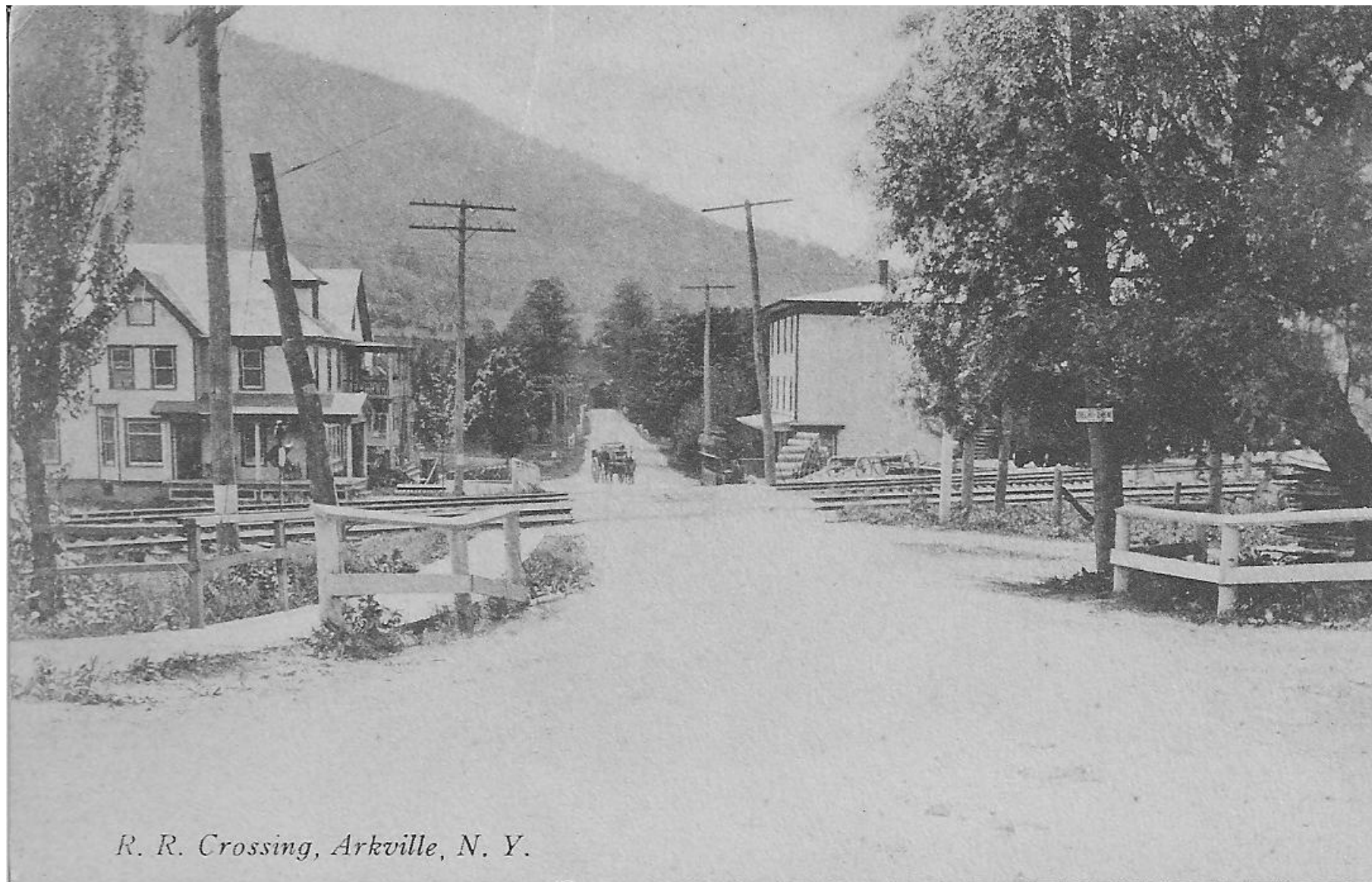

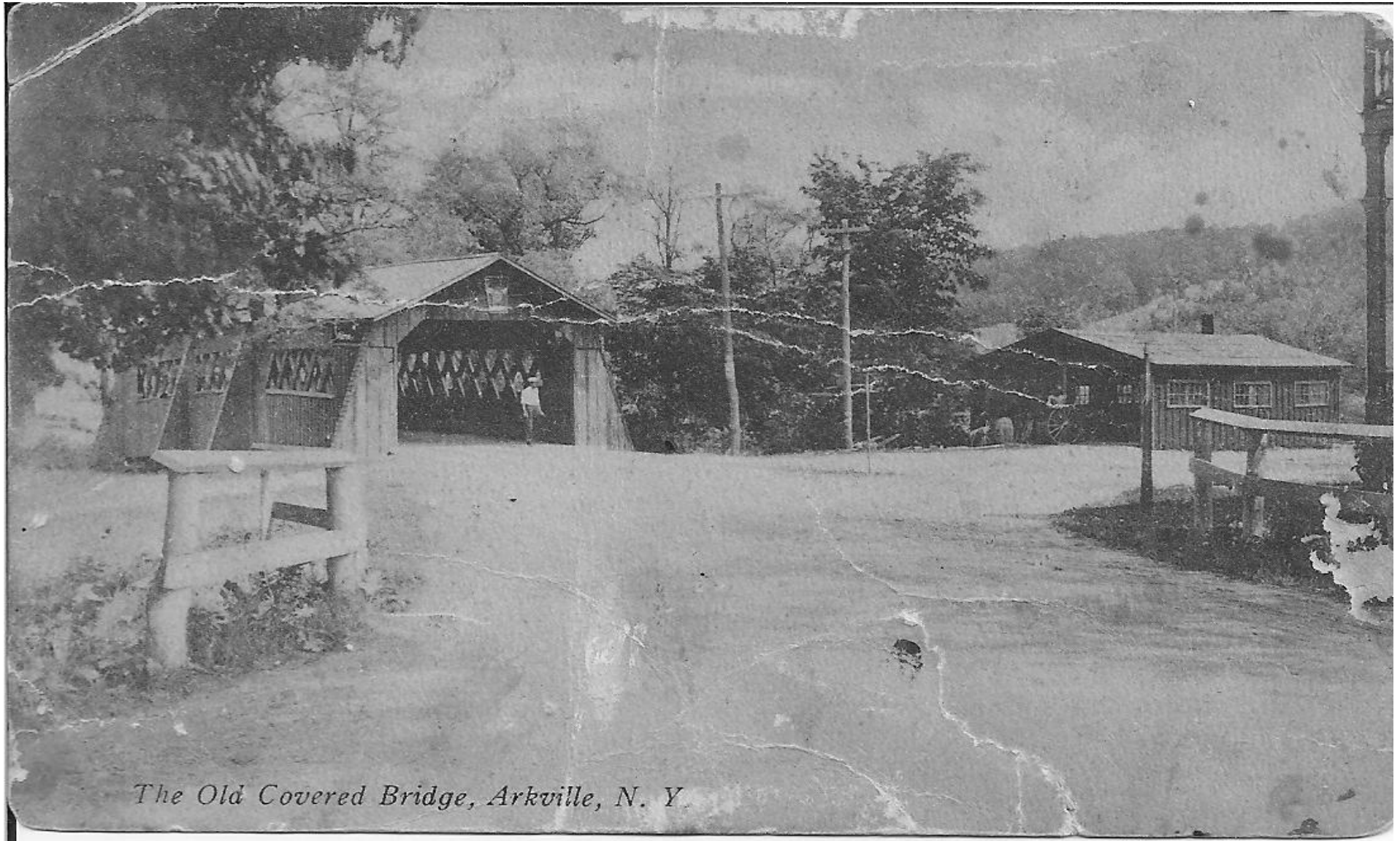

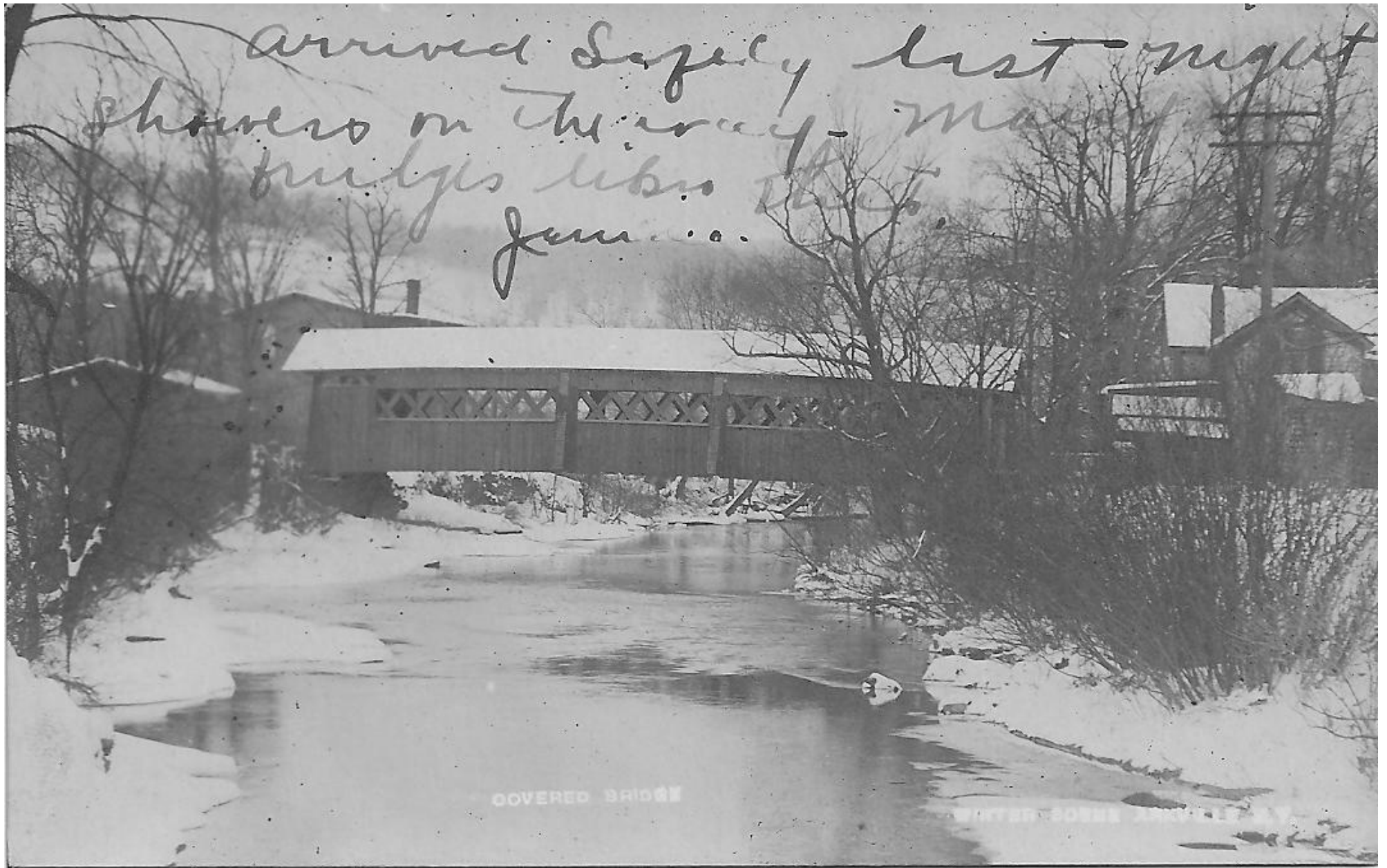

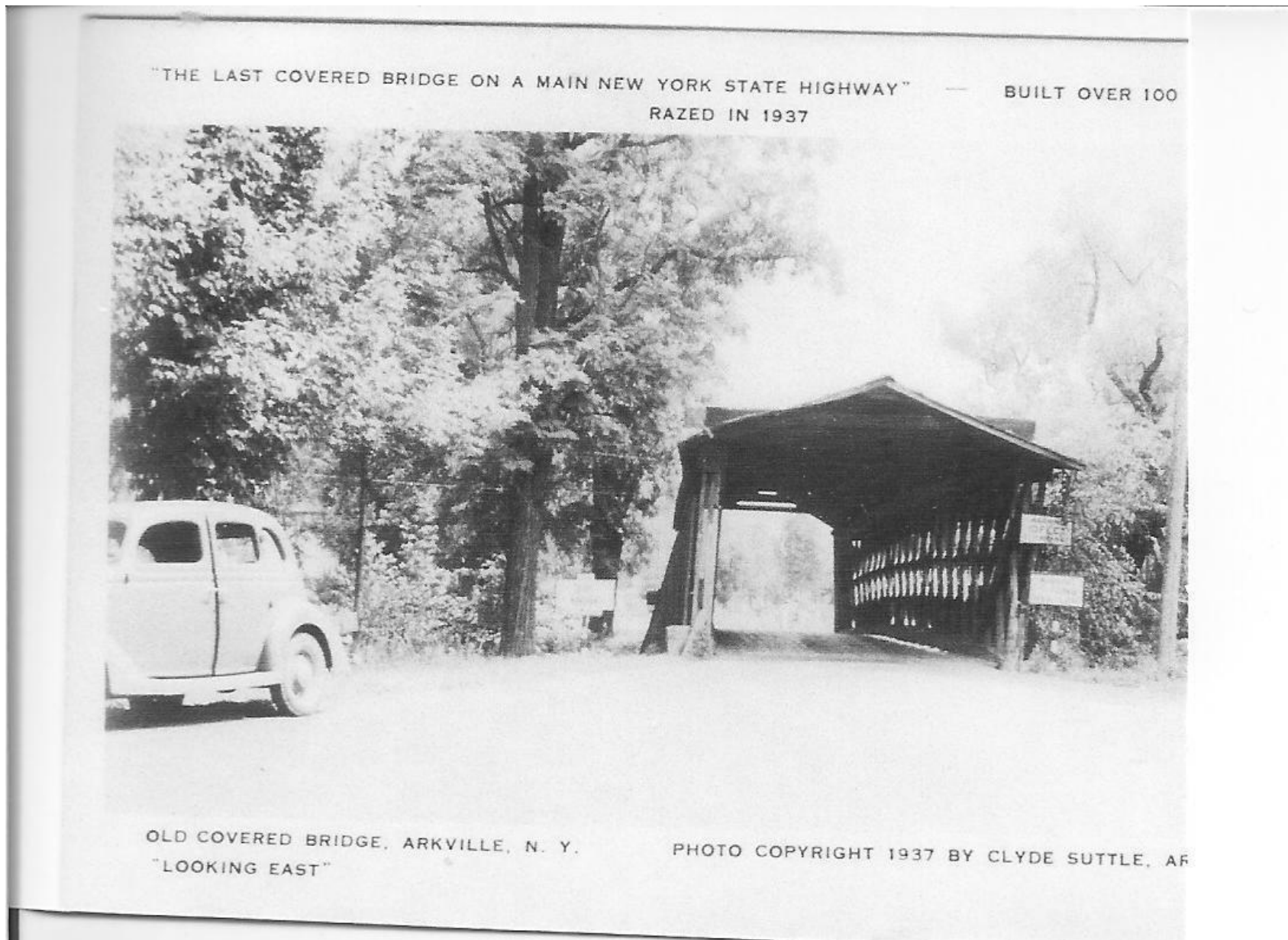
