Warren W. Scudder was born in Roxbury in 1812. He was a son of Old School Baptist Church Deacon Jotham Wood Scudder (1766-1862) and Mary Embree (1766-1841).

Jotham and Mary had 9 children: Deborah (1792-1868), Joseph (1794-1884), William (1795-1868), Maria (1806-1880), Elizabeth (Betsy, 1802-1863), Embree (1803-1861), (Maria 2?), Philetus (1808-) and **Warren Woolsey**, who would gain considerable notoriety as an Anti-Rent War leader.

In 1830, Warren Scudder married Melinda (Linda) Kelly (1812-1893). She was a daughter of Reuben and Mary Kelly of Halcottsville. Warren and Malinda had four children: Edward Smith Scudder (variously known as Smith, or Edward); Reuben, named for his grandpa; Jackson, and Mary, named for her grandma.

Warren and Linda lived in Roxbury in 1850, 55 and 60, when son Reuben was a schoolteacher, Jackson was a farm laborer, and Smith was a teamster. Jackson served in the Civil War (as did two cousins, Webber and James Scudder; James died in the service). Jackson later owned a livery in Margaretville. (Ironically, he was elected constable in 1875.) Smith went west and became a railroad engineer in Illinois. Mary married William Rowe and moved to Brooklyn.

Warren and Linda lived in Hardenburgh in 1865 and 70, and in Middletown in 1875.

Then they seem to have split up. Linda was living with son Jackson and family in Margaretville in 1880, while Warren was living with nephew Jonathan Scudder, his wife Harriet and two teenage children in Halcott.

When Warren died, sometime in the 1880s, he was buried in Jonathan Scudder's plot, according to a descendant. There are 4 names on the large monument (Jonathan, Harriet, and their daughters Mary and Emma), and there are four individual stones with their initials. A fifth small stone is unmarked.

It's not known where Linda is buried.

Soldier to fish farmer

Research into the lives of Middletown's Civil War veterans has revealed more than a few intriguing and inventive men behind the uniforms.

One of those was Julius G. Smith. Born in Glen Aubrey, NY May 18, 1840 to George and Achsa Millard Smith, he was also known as Junious, or just plain June Smith. The family evidently migrated to Delaware County (George and Achsa died in the 1850s and are buried in Woodland Cemetery. Delhi). Twenty-one-year-old June came to Middletown to enlist in Company E of the 3rd NY Cavalry on August 11, 1861. For four years, he saw plenty of action throughout the Carolinas and Virginia, including the siege of Petersburg. His profile in the 1880 Munsell's History of Delaware County counts 63 combat engagements. He appears to have escaped unharmed, and was discharged in July of 1865.

June was almost 30 when he married Adelaide (Ada) Jackson, daughter of Luther and Martha Jackson of Dingle Hill in the Town of Andes. The couple first lived with her parents, where June worked on the farm before setting up their own household in Dunraven. There were three children, Irving, Chauncey and Millard.

June Smith must have loved to tinker because he invented what became known as the "June Smith Creamer." Just what it looked like or did is anyone's guess - perhaps separated the cream from the milk -- but It turns up in farm auction notices and in at least one article in the *Catskill Mountain News* where a 1947 story about a display of old time farm tools at Bussy's Store in Margaretville described the "June Smith milk cooler, the patented invention of a Margaretville man."

By the mid-1880s, though, June was more interested in fish than cows. Angling historian Ed VanPut writes in *The Beaverkill* that June Smith had been a fishing guide since he got out of the Army, and in 1889, traded his Dunraven farm for one carved out of the forest in the Town of Hardenburgh by Asahel and William Bryant. There Smith envisioned a resort to attract wealthy anglers who were coming to fish the nearby Beaverkill.

A partnership with fellow Civil War veteran Charles Odell, a wealthy Pittsburgh steel manufacturer, helped June Smith turn the farm's Aulder Pond into 55-acre Alder Lake, stocked with native brook trout supplemented with those raised at a hatchery built below the dam. Smith was good at propagating trout, too good perhaps. The partnership between him and Colonel Odell dissolved in 1891, and Alder Lake became the domain of a private club of wealthy Hudson Valley men. Most prominent among them was Samuel Coykendall, a millionaire railroad and steamboat company owner who ultimately purchased the shares of the other owners, built a three story stone mansion in 1900 and enlarged his estate to 1600 acres.

In 1945, the property passed from the Coykendalls to another private club, and then became a Boy Scout Reservation for Nassau County, LI scout troops. Legendary local outdoorsman Niles Fairbairn was the camp caretaker for many years, living in the Coykendall mansion. The

property became part of the State Forest Preserve in 1980. The mansion was razed in recent years.

But back to June Smith.

After Alder Lake, he established Orchard Lake Hatchery on a tributary of the Willowemoc Creek in Sullivan County. Owned by tanner Stoddard Hammond, that hatchery too became a private club for a group of New York City sportsmen.

And so June Smith moved on to Liberty, constructing a third hatchery to sell trout to various fishing clubs and landowners. He was well known for pioneering and advancing this Catskill 'industry,' assisted by son Chauncey. He entertained anglers and hatchery visitors from far and wide.

In 1902, the Livingston Manor Ensign newspaper seemed prepared to write the trout farmer's obituary. "June Smith of Liberty was perhaps fatally injured in a runaway near that village yesterday. The team he was driving became frightened and ran away, throwing him out and breaking both legs. The wagon ran over him, injuring him internally."

But June Smith, survivor of dozens of fierce southern battles in his youth, was made of tougher stuff. He recovered and lived another 20 years. He passed away in the early 1920s in Liberty and was buried in Arena. When the Pepacton Reservoir was built, June and Adelaide Smith were reinterred in the Sanford Cemetery, Dunraven.

California voter registration forms indicate George Stone, B. NY, in San Diego 1873, and in San Francisco 1876, 1888 and 1898, as a bookkeeper then contractor. He is a 'railroad contractor' in SF City Directory 1889.

George's youngest brother Rutson J. Stone also emigrated to California after his mother died (1878) and is in San Francisco 1880 census with wife and 3 children, then LA in 1900.

From 1895 Biographical Review of Delaware County: Burr Todd came into possession of his father's farm (Clovesville and Dry Brook), but enlarged his business by carrying the neighboring farmers' produce to Kingston in his line of wagons, and fetching back groceries and family supplies. So entirely trustworthy was he that he established quite a business by this simple arrangement. At thirty-eight years of age he bought the hardware store of W. D. Doolittle, and was equally successful as he had been in other lines of business. In 1856, at Griffin's Corners, where he established himself in mercantile life, he married Miss Susan Stone. Miss Stone was born December 5, 1835, and was a daughter of Robert and Caroline (Griffin) Stone. Robert, her father, was born in Clovesville, and was the son of Russell Stone, an early settler and a man of progressive ideas. Ten children were reared by the parents of Mrs. Todd: Hannah; Augustus; Susan L.; John F.; Mary; George; William H.; Josephine; and Rutson and Hudson, who were twins.

John Finkle Stone enlisted in US Army's 5th Infantry in 1857. The **5th Infantry Regiment**, nicknamed the "Bobcats", is the third-oldest infantry regiment of

the<u>United States Army</u> In early 1857 the 5th moved to south Florida, where they spent several months skirmishing with <u>Seminoles</u> in the area around <u>Fort Myers</u>. The 5th left Florida in June for <u>Fort Laramie</u> in modern-day <u>Wyoming</u>, where they took part in the <u>Buchanan</u> administration's <u>expedition against the Mormons</u>. The regiment stayed at Camp Floyd (later Fort Crittenden) in the <u>Great Salt Lake</u> valley until the autumn of 1860, when it moved to <u>New Mexico</u> for <u>operations against the Navajos</u>.

The 5th Infantry spent the Civil War in the territory of New Mexico. The regiment was ordered to concentrate at <u>Albuquerque</u> in the spring of 1861 for a move east, but the department commander persuaded Washington to leave the 5th on the frontier. In early 1862 a Confederate force from Texas invaded New Mexico. Four companies of the 5th formed the Union rear guard in the Confederate victory at <u>Valverde</u> on 21 February, after which the Confederates occupied Albuquerque and <u>Santa Fe</u>.

Two other companies of the 5th captured a field piece at the <u>Battle of Glorieta</u> <u>Pass</u> on 28 March, the beginning of the end for the Confederate forces. The 5th also fought in the action at <u>Peralta</u> on 15 April where the enemy lost a large part of their supply train. The Confederates ultimately withdrew to <u>San Antonio</u>, and the 5th spent the rest of the war on frontier duty, watching for another Confederate incursion, which never came.

On 1 June 1863 <u>John F. Reynolds</u> officially became colonel of the 5th; however, he was on detached service as a Major General of Volunteers, commanding a corps of the <u>Army of the Potomac</u>. He was killed a month later on the first day of the <u>Battle of Gettysburg</u>. His replacement as commander of the 5th was another volunteer general, <u>Daniel Butterfield</u>, the composer of the bugle call "<u>Taps</u>". Butterfield, also wounded at Gettysburg, did not join the regiment during the war.

Notes: From backgrounder prepared for 2013 Living History Tour of Clovesville Cemetery:

John Finkle Stone went west, to Arizona, where he had a gold mine and was killed by Apaches in 1869. From History of Arizona, Vol II, Thomas E. Farish, 1915, pg 206. The Tucson Post prints the following: "Stone Avenue was named for John F. Stone. Just how or why he came to the country no one now living seems to know. He was a man of considerable means and of magnificent physique. Of powerful build and wearing a heavy black beard he stood distinguished among his fellow men. A rich gold vein had been discovered in Apache Pass and upon

this he built a small reduction mill. While en route to Tucson with the proceeds of the first month's run, he was killed by Indians in Dragoon Pass about 1500 yards east of the old stage station. The driver of the stage, two soldiers and two other civilians were killed at the same time. Sometime in the early 1860's he built the first house on Stone Avenue. "Historical account from the Tucson paper: "On Oct. 5, 1869, a Col. John Finkle Stone, the 33-year-old president of Apache Pass Mine, near Ft. Bowie, headed back to his home in Tucson aboard a mail coach. He had an escort of four. When they approached an abandoned stagecoach station at the north end of the Dragoon Mountains, a bunch of Apaches camouflaged with weeds jumped out of a gully and hit them fast and hard. Stone, the coach driver, and all of the soldiers were killed. The news stunned Tucson, where Stone--for whom Stone Avenue was later named--was well-known and admired. John Stone is buried at Ft Bowie, AZ In March 1895, the army moved all the officers, enlisted men, military dependents and unknowns to the National Cemetery in San Francisco. Today, civilian graves are all that remain at Fort Bowie Cemetery and include:

John Finkle Stone

John Finkle Stone was born in Griffin's Corner, New York, in 1836. Enlisting in the US Army's 5th Infantry in 1857, he served in Utah and New Mexico. After his discharge in New Mexico he became a U.S. Marshall. In April 1867, he was appointed Collector of Customs for the District of El Paso Del Norte and relocated to Tucson, Arizona. Known by his many friends as being energetic and of strong character, he helped organize the Apache Pass Mining Company in 1868 and was elected president and superintendent of the firm. The company was established to develop the Harris Lode mining district near Fort Bowie. On October 5, 1869, he boarded a stage for Tucson with the driver and a four soldier escort. All were killed by Apaches near Dragoon Springs the same day. His body was removed a year later to the Fort Bowie Cemetery. The term "supposed to be" on his restored headstone was sometimes used when due to some circumstances, such as condition of the body or lack of identification of the grave, the actual name of the person is somewhat in doubt. The colonel rank was honorary.
